Practice Overview

Sarah Williams is an award-nominated barrister, specialising in construction, engineering, infrastructure and energy disputes. She appears regularly in the Courts of England and Wales, in international arbitrations, and in UK adjudications and their enforcement.

Sarah's practice encompasses a diverse range of subject matter, contractual form, and dispute forum. She has recently been involved in a long running technically-complex infrastructure dispute to trial in respect of the design and construction of a guided busway in Cambridgeshire, UK. Sarah has been involved in a number of glass curtain walling disputes, both domestically and internationally. She has also been instructed in a number of oil and gas disputes, including an ICC arbitration in respect of issues of termination arising from an oil and gas facility in the Middle East, throughout an LCIA arbitration to final hearing concerning an EPF in the Middle East, and in respect of a Section 68 challenge arising out of that dispute. Sarah is recognised for the quality of her oral and written advocacy, and her approachable, straightforward style.
